General information

- For candidates who are completing a training, eLearning, or self-study course with a PECB Partner, the training fee covers the first exam attempt, one free retake, the certification application fee, and the first year of the Annual Maintenance Fee (AMF). This cycle must be completed within 12 months of the course completion date for instructor-led training, or within 12 months of the purchase date for self-study and eLearning formats.
- Candidates will receive more than 300 pages of comprehensive training materials, including practical examples, exercises, and quizzes.
- An attestation of course completion worth 21 CPD (Continuing Professional Development) credits will be awarded to the candidate.
- If the initial exam is not passed, a free retake is available within 12 months of the course completion date. For self-study or eLearning courses, the 12-month period starts from the date of purchase.
